

## Letters from The Lighthouse by Emma Carroll

*Non-Fiction Unit:* Recount

February, 1941. After months of bombing raids in London, twelve-year-old Olive Bradshaw and her little brother Cliff are evacuated to the Devon coast. The only person with two spare beds is Mr Ephraim, the local lighthouse keeper. But he's not used to company and he certainly doesn't want any evacuees. Desperate to be helpful, Olive becomes his post-girl, carrying secret messages (as she likes to think of the letters) to the villagers. But Olive has a secret of her own.

**Skills:** Conjunctions for cohesion, accurate punctuation, use of commas in lists, contractions and possession, varying sentence types and secure use of adverbials, prepositions and pronouns.

**Spelling Focus:** ambitious synonyms, homophones, -ant/-ance/-ancy words, -ent/-ence/-ency words, hyphenated words.

This half term, Year 6 are focusing on three big areas of Maths: **Place Value, the Four Operations, and Fractions**. Below is a simple outline of what your child will be learning:



# R.S.E.

Calming the Storm:

Religious Understanding explores the Gospel story of the 'Calming of the Storm' (from Matthew, Mark and Luke). Over five story sessions, children will consider experiences of change, growth and development, and the trust that they can have in the person of Jesus through times of trial and tribulation.

# Religion

Story of the People of God: Develop their knowledge and understanding of the structure of the Bible and the forms of literature that are found in the different books.

Followers of Christ: We consider the call of the disciples by Jesus. The children will learn about the demands that the call of Christ placed on these first disciples.
