


# Nursery

# Literacy

Word Reading: Listen carefully and discriminate between sounds.

Recognise that print has meaning and that it can be used for different purposes.

Develop book-handling skills - recognising that we read left to right, top to bottom. Turn pages with care and name the different parts of a book — pages, front cover, back cover. Know pages have an order. Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can: - spot and suggest rhymes - count or clap syllables in a word - recognise words with the same initial sound, such as cat and cup.

### Comprehension:

Engage in conversations about stories they have listened to — express simple likes and dislikes.


Retrieve answers from a story answering what and who questions.

Learn new vocabulary linked to stories, rhymes, non-fiction and poems.

Join in with repeated regrains in familiar stories.

## Writing:

Copying circles and crosses. First letter of name.





# Numeracy

#### Non-Number:

Spatial Reasoning

2D/3D shapes





Triangle Square



Pentagon

Talk about and explore 2/d/3d shapes (circles, rectangles, triangles and cuboids)

Focus on Mathematical language: sides, corners, straight, flat, round

Support and discuss questions like; 'What is the same and what is different?'

#### Number:

Subilising 1-3 (Two or three? /How many? /Five Frame)

Recognising small groups of 1, 2,3.

Regular sequence counting of 1,2,3 eq. Rocket launch countdowns.

Using items around the classroom to count and repeat the last number "I, 2, 3-3 cars!" & "Please get me 3 apples."

Show 'finger numbers' up to 5

Mathematical discussions indoors/outdoors: 'I think Jasmin has got more crackers than...'



# Nursery **Term: Spring 2—2025**



### Communication & Language Listening, attention and

Understanding: Begin to listen to longer stories and recall some key events. Understand clear 2 step instructions. Understand and answer 'why' questions. Speaking: Retell familiar Nursery and Number rhymes. Speak in longer sentences (4 to 6 words). Start a conversation and take turns speaking and listening. Use talk to organise their play.

#### Physical Development Fine Motor Skills:

Develop strength in small muscles in hands and fingers to support writing, tying shoe laces and other fine motor skills. Activities will include using scissors, building with small blocks, threading and play with playdough. Gross Motor Skills: Develop control, movement and coordination of the body. Activites will include large movements during outdoor play and PE.

#### Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Religious Understanding firstly helps children to understand why the Bible is so special to Christians, and secondly helps children to act out the Gospel account of Jesus washing His disciples' feet, showing that He loves us and is a role model for us Know that there are different to copy in loving one another.

# Expressive Arts & Design
