Fiction Unit: Twisted Traditional Tales



Big Cats

Non-Fiction Unit: Non-chronological report



Using a model report on Terrifying Tigers, the children will learn to craft their own report on a Big Cat of their choice. They will learn to use the key features of a non-chronological report for the purpose of information sharing. This will surely be a roarsome report!


Skills: Consistent use of capital letters and full stops. Phonetically plausible spelling. Use of and/but. Use of -ing/-ed words and begin to use prefix -un.

Spelling Focus: /n/ words spell with 'kn'/'gn', /wr/ words, sound /s/ spell 'c' before e/i/y, /f/ words spell with -dge and -ge, /f/ words spell with 'g'.


Maths

Place value / number packs:

- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens, ones)
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs
- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- Use number bonds facts to apply to number bonds to 100 (e.g. If you know number bonds for 7, you know it for 70. $10 + 60 = 70$ because $1 + 6 = 7$)
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems.



$$25 + \boxed{61} = 86$$



Addition & Subtraction:

- Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a two-digit number and ones. No regrouping (not crossing 10/100 progressively).



$$\boxed{3} \times \boxed{2} = \boxed{6}$$

Multiplication:

- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers
- Draw and make arrays to represent a times table - 3×5 means that you have groups of three, 4 times
- Show that multiplication is commutative (the answer is the same if you swap the numbers around, all this does is changes the way it's grouped)

Craft & Design: Map it out!
Children to explore and create maps through various art forms, including drawing, felt making, printmaking, and designing stained glass.
Developing skills in sorting, designing, and evaluating art.

The Gunpowder Plot:

Let the Children Come:

Religious Understanding introduces children to the story from the Gospel of Matthew, when Jesus welcomed all of the little children to come to Him. The five-story sessions encourage children to understand that they are created by God out of love and for love. Children will revisit this Gospel story at the end of this Module.

Religion

Old Testament Stories & Prayers:

Stories and the characters of the Old Testament. Also introduce them to important images of God found in the scriptures. **Sharing in the Life of Jesus:** The life of Mary and Jesus and the call of the disciples. They will also learn about some saints who have responded to the call of Jesus.

Science

Living thing and their Habitats:

Exploring if things are living, dead or have never been alive. Children will then look at microhabitats and larger habitats identifying some animals that may live there. Conduct an investigation to see which type of conditions woodlice prefer in their habitat. After that they will look at how living things are adapted to their environment. Finally they will look at food chains within habitats.
