

Thornhill by Pam Smy Fiction Unit: Ghost Narrative

1982: Mary is a lonely orphan at the Thornhill Institute For Children at the very moment that it's shutting its doors. When her pew priends are all adopted or re-homed and she's lept to pace a volatile bully alone, her revenge will have a lasting effect on the bully, on Mary, and on Thornhill itself. This qhostly story will inspire their own haunted narratives.
