



Literacy

Word Reading:

Recap on set I single sound AND special friends: th, ch, qu, ng, nk.

Secure blending of words with special friends (word time 1.5 and 1.6).

Blend sounds to read words AND Read short dilty stories.

Comprehension:

To act out stories.

To begin to predict what may happen in the story. To suggest how a story might end,

Writing:

Form lower case and capital letters correctly.

Write own first and surname.

Begin to write short phrases, verbally rehearsing them first.

Begin to write dictated phrases.

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Learning to Read and Write:

As a School we use **Read Write Inc.** as a programme of study for the teaching of early reading and writing.



This half term we are focussing on orally blending sounds into words. Click/tap the images to watch a video explaining.





Your child will learn to read in a very simple way:

- Read letters by their 'sounds'
- 2. Blend these sounds into words
- 3. Read the words in a story.

More information will be shared with you soon about supporting your child with reading and writing. Keep watch for presentations, booklets and workshops in the future. However, if you are eager to learn more, check out the following website: https://www.ruthmiskin.com/parents/

First, your child will learn to read:

Set I Speed Sounds
(in this order):
These are sounds written
with one letter:
masdtinpgock
ubfelhrjv
ywzx
Watch the 'How to Say
Sounds' video online.

Once your child knows at least the first 5 sounds, they will learn words containing these sounds, by sound-blending:

m-a-t mat, c-a-t cat, g-o-t got, f-i-sh fish, s-p-o-t spot, b-e-s-t best.

Later your child will learn sounds written with two letters:

Your child will call these 'special friends'

sh th ch qu ng nk ck

As soon as your child can orally blend, they will start to read appropriate books:

Blending Books and Red, Green and Purple Storybooks.
